Leaves, Brush and Yard Waste Policy



Brush Pick Up

- The first Monday of each month starting May 2nd thru Nov. 7th.
- **Do not put brush out more than two days prior to pick -up.**
- A city vehicle may be available for transport if you do not have a truck or trailer. Call City Hall @ 294-6912 for availability.
- Storm Damage Brush Pick-up may be considered if damage is extreme, call City Hall.

Leaf Pick Up

- Spring April 11 thru May 6 - weather permitting
- Fall October 3 thru Nov. 18th - weather permitting
- Place leaves within 4 ft. of the curb away from mailboxes, trees and garbage
- Leaves placed by contractors will not be picked-up

Bulky Waste Pick-up will be Monday May 9th.

- No Electronics -TVs, Microwaves, Computers, Dehumidifiers, Washers, Dryers, Refrigerators

Compost Site

- 7:30 a.m.–3:00 p.m. - Monday through Friday
- 8:00 am – 4:00pm - Saturday from April 16 through November 12th.
- An attendant will be on duty *most* Saturdays for assistance.
- Special after hours appointments can be made for Wednesday afternoons. Please call City Hall at 294-6912 by Monday to set up time.
- Mirror stickers will be provided to each resident. We are asking you to apply it to your inside rear-view mirror facing the windshield so when you visit the site our employees can verify residency. The materials deposited at the site must be from within the city limits.
- No contractors can use the site. The area will be monitored by video cameras for security.

Dumpsters

- On-site after Saturday May 14th until five dumpsters provided are filled.
- It is a violation to drop off refrigerators, electronics, televisions, computers, concrete, dehumidifiers, washers and dryers at any time.

Personal Mulching and Compost Pile

Residents are encouraged to create their own compost pile near their garden or in a back corner of their lot. It's easy to do. Just form a pile with grass clippings and garden waste. Turn the pile once per week and water if it gets too dry. The natural process will take over and in a year you have great topsoil for flowers beds and gardens. Residents are also encouraged to mulch their grass and leaves in the yard. It's good for the turf!
