Leaves, Brush and Yard Waste Policy



Brush Pick Up

- The first Monday of each month starting May 7th thru Nov. 5th.
- If a Holiday falls on a Monday, Brush will be picked up on Tuesday
- **Do not put brush out more than two days prior to pick -up**
- A city vehicle may be available for transport if you do not have a truck or trailer. Call City Hall @ 294-6912 for availability
- Storm damage Brush Pick-up may be considered if damage is extreme, call City Hall
- Brush piles larger than a pick-up truck load are subject to \$150 per hour fee

Leaf Pick Up

- Spring April 9th thru May 7th - weather permitting
- Fall October 1st thru Nov. 16th - weather permitting
- Place leaves within 4 ft. of the curb away from mailboxes, trees and garbage
- Leaves placed by contractors will not be picked-up

Bulky Waste Pick-up will be Monday May 7th.

- **No Electronics** -TVs, Microwaves, Computers, Dehumidifiers, Washer, Dryers and Refrigerators

Compost Site – Residential Use Only

- 7:30 a.m.–3:00 p.m. - Monday through Friday
- 8:00 am – 4:00pm - Saturday from April 14th through November 10th.
- An attendant will be on duty *most* Saturdays for assistance.
- Mirror stickers will be provided to each resident. We are asking you to apply it to the front side of your inside rear-view mirror so when you visit the site our employees can verify residency. The materials deposited at the site must be from within the city limits.
- No contractors can use the site. The area will be monitored by video cameras for security
- Commercial Properties will be charged \$100 per pick-up truck load for Brush drop off.

Dumpsters – Bulky Waste

- On-site after Saturday May 12th Until five dumpsters provided are filled
- It is a violation to drop off refrigerators, electronics, dehumidifiers, televisions, computers, concrete, residential garbage, card board and large amounts of paper at any time.

Mulching and Compost Pile

Grass Clippings- Mulch, Do Not Bag – It is much better for your lawn and the environment. See back. Residents are encouraged to create their own compost pile near their garden or in a back corner of their lot. It's easy to do. Just form a pile with grass clippings and garden waste.

Turn the pile once per month and water if it gets too dry. The natural process will take over and in a year you have great topsoil for flowers beds and gardens.
