OF THE WHOLE MEETING – MAY 11, 2026**

Meeting was called to order at 5:00 pm by Mayor Raymond Radis. Pledge of Allegiance was recited followed by a moment of silent meditation.

Certification of Open Meeting Law: Agenda was posted May 8, 2026.

Roll Call: Danielle Reysen, Chris Foos, Sheila Pulice, Jody Kugler, & Jon McConnell. Absent: Mark Wilton. Also Present: City Attorney Jesse Spankowski, Police Chief Jessica Schroeder & Public Works Director Jason Carley

Approval of Agenda: Motion by Foos, second by McConnell to approve. Motion carried.

Presentation: Taylor Haag Strauser & Stephanie Prellwitz from Green Lake Association provided information on Green Lake's Economic Impact Study.

Boards, Commissions, Committees Minutes: Motion made by Foos, second by McConnell to receive Minutes from Fire Commission – 03/25/2026; Board of Zoning Appeals- 04/06/2026; Historic Preservation Commission- 04/08/2026; Plan Commission- 04/13/2026; Park & Recreation – 04/15/2026. Motion carried.

Committee & Department Head Reports: Jon McConnell gave an oral report regarding the Park & Recreation/Tree Board. Christopher Foos gave an oral report regarding Ad Hoc for Economic Development & Revitalization. Samantha Gerth gave an oral report regarding the Clerk/Treasurer Office. Police Chief Jessica Schroeder gave an oral report regarding the Police Department. Public Works Director Jason Carley provided a report. Christopher Foos gave an oral report regarding the Fire Commission and EMS Services.

City Compost Site Burn Update: Jason Carley provided a report and stated he submitted burn permit to Fire Chief Wagner and they had a productive conversation. Fire Chief Wagner would like the ordinance amended to state the city would be allowed to burn at  X  site for  X  amount of times with the same guidelines as a regularly issued burning permit.

Outlook Pier at Mill Pond: Jon McConnell stated the funds have been donated. There is a path leading towards the outlook pier by the Chief Highknocker statute.

Temporary Street Privilege Permit: Chief Schroeder expressed concerns with the platform being in the roadway. There was discussion about adding cement blockades to the platform for added security. Motion made by Foos, second by McConnell to suspend the rules to allow Alyse Paulsen to speak. Motion carried. Attorney Spankowski stated the ordinance should be changed to a permanent ordinance with seasonal restrictions instead of the temporary ordinance.
